About *Strange Fruit*

This book tells the story of a song written by Abel Meeropol, a Jewish schoolteacher, and made famous by Billie Holiday. Holiday's interpretation of the song profoundly affected those who heard it. It was the first song to make a direct reference to lynching, and the first protest song of the civil rights movement.

Strange Fruit was published in 2001 without an index.

About the Index

The index was formatted in indented style with two subheading levels. Double-spacing between main headings was used to allow easy scanning for names of the many people who tell the story of *Strange Fruit* while, at the same time, providing detailed access to names of people who dominate the story.

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
